SSI launches special series, Nature-Inspired Tours and Talks, featuring Moti Azpurua

The Nature- inspired Tours and Talks series takes students on virtual experiences all around Abu Dhabi, featuring trips and online sessions to discover fun environmental facts! Moti's love for animals began when he was only 4 years old but today, he is recognized for knowing countless facts about animals with over 2500 followers on his social media accounts. He has visited places all around the world to learn about natural habitats including Egypt, Venezuela, Hong Kong, Mexico, and Florida, aiming to one day become an animal conservationist exploring wildlife.

The Zoom session which was entitled 'Wondrous Turtles of AI Dhafra that Inhibit UAE Waters' saw record participation! Over 680 students tuned in to learn all about turtles! A live Q&A session featured the differences between Hawksbill sea turtles and Green sea turtles, such as their head shape and beaks. Moti also explained the life cycle of turtles beginning with eggs, hatching, juvenile phase, and adulthood which generally takes about 6 weeks. Students also learned about dangers affecting turtles including plastic bags found in the sea, which they can mistake for jelly fish and possibly kill them.

Moti encourages viewers to reduce their plastic use and recycle when possible to save the turtles!

Green Achiever

Arab Environment Day Celebration, Food Sustainability and Security Webinar

Over 13 schools from Kuwait, UAE and India participated in this virtual webinar, including SSI Lead Schools, Alain Junior School, Gems UIS, Abu Dhabi Indian School, Al Ittihad National Private School, and Private International English school.

Over 1500 students joined the Zoom session, along with guest speakers Jane Goodall, Founder of the Jane Goodall Institute, Tara Goshan, Director of Roots & Shoots UAE, Nick Cochrane-Dyet, Chairman of the British Business Group Abu Dhabi and Khansa Al Blouki, Director of Environmental Outreach at Environment Agency -Abu Dhabi, who celebrated Arab Environment Day.

Students explored the topics Food Security and Technological Advancement in Food Sustainability including the impact of technology on food sustainability and the rising need for food security. The message of sustainability was further spread through dances and skits which made the event vibrant.

Interactive sessions with the audience, such as live quizzes and games, made it enjoyable and entertaining for students. The panel and viewers discussed different ways they can combat the environmental issues and spread awareness.

SSI announces Green School Audit results

SSI Green School Audit announces 2019-2020 results showcasing remarkable achievements from the SSI network throughout the last academic year. The Bright Riders School engaged in the three-tier audit for a greener space - focusing on waste, land, and water. Students and faculty members were able to repurpose 1102 kgs of recycled waste, including creating paper bags from recycled newspapers, converting food waste into organic compost, and transforming water bottles into a beautiful display of the UAE flag.

Students also explored the school's greenery, analyzing plant species, and conducting research on endangered native plants. To monitor water consumption, students regularly took readings from the water meters and sanitation staff conducted an inspection to see how water can be reduced in hygienic practices. To increase sustainability amid the pandemic, Al Ekhlass Private School aimed to reduce percentage of waste on school campus by 20%. Students partook in the Masdar City activity to build the world's largest artwork made from recycled materials, reaching 1,015 square meters- almost the size of two basketball courts. The mosaic artwork received a Guinness World Record award, containing almost 90,500 recycled items, including plastic bottles, cans and cardboard!

An SSI component, Green School Audit, is a tool designed to help school communities audit their use of natural resources, enabling them to become environmental managers who assess and implement sustainable practices in education systems.

Life in the Sky book



An original Environment Agency- Abu Dhabi (EAD) production, Life in the Sky takes readers on an exploration of endangered birds around the world. It captures the survival story of these magnificent species; how civilization has destroyed their habitat, and how EAD supports local and global organizations to help them. Throughout the book, the birds will introduce themselves to readers, explaining their characteristics, how they fly, hunt food, and their survival struggles.

iEnviro-Spellathon

iEnviro-Spellathon, is Environment Agency- Abu Dhabi (EAD) initiative, teaches students about local flora, fauna and environmental issues in a way that is accessible for everyone, and it works on developing their awareness and language skills around local terminology

To date, over 1.8 million students across the UAE have joined the initiative, available from grades KG to sixth grade. Over the years, the program has evolved from used books, to an interactive app featuring 18 games, 12 animations, 9 interactive animations, in both English and Arabic. An additional feature is a live testing section, where students are encouraged to examine their knowledge and the results are sent by email to teachers, in addition to a certificate of participation.
