The Abu Dhabi Indian School has sent over **12** teachers for **five** TOTS' (Training of Trainer) in the 2012-13 academic session.

While the school definitely gained points for attendance, it is the implementation and the integration of the training that has a higher weightage. The Abu Dhabi Indian School showed instances and evidence of integration of various activities and games taught in the trainings. The teachers who were trained at the agency went back to their schools and shared the training with the other teachers and found ways to integrate it.

It is now a part of their curriculum; Activities like the “Who am I?” game from the Biodiversity Training, water education, Watershed activity from our External Training on innovative methods in Environment Education which is now a part of the school intermediate level geography calls are a few examples of instances where the integration has been done.

Another noteworthy integration was from the “Fisheries” TOT; the school took their grade 11 economics students to do a similar kind of study of the local fish species sold in the retail outlets. Other students have studied the fishing techniques and species caught and sold at the Fish Market, as well as the restaurants to work on their Internal as well as External Action Project. “ Choose Your Fish Wisely!”.
